BARREL RACING

- Entries limited to 80 contestants. Qualifications: Top 20 from the 2023 Pro Rodeo World Standings. Top 32 will be selected from 2024 Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing World Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing; Top 2 will be selected from the 2023 WPRA Tour Standings; Top 10 will be selected from 2023 Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing Wilderness Circuit Year End Standings; Top 16 will be selected from the 2024 Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing Wilderness Circuit Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing. The "30-hour replacement policy" will be in effect.
- 2. Entry Fee: \$421 (\$400 entry fee + \$21 Procom Fee)
- 3. Format will be: One Round + Progressive Round (32) and a Finals (8).
- 4. Qualifying slack will be July 16 at 10:00am at the Utah Days of '47 Arena at the Utah State Fairpark. The top 32 from the first round will advance to the Progressive Round (will not exceed 32) held during the first four (4) performances (8 per performance).
- 5. Qualifying Slack Advancement Tie Breakers: Ties will be broken by taking the highest ranked contestant in the 2024 WPRA Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing World Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing.
- 6. Performance preferences for the Progressive Round will be accepted by the rodeo secretary in writing no later than one (1) hour following the end of the first go round for GBR. The priority list will be determined by the top 32 times in the GBR. The contestant will receive her first preference, and if not available, will receive her second preference prior to moving to the next contestant on the priority list.
- 7. Progressive Round Trades: After the Progressive Performance positions are posted, for the first three performances, contestants will have until 12:00 PM (Noon)(MDT) on day of performance to complete trades with the rodeo secretary. The deadline applies to the first performance in the trade. For example, if contestants are trading between the 1st and the 4th performance, the trade deadline is 12:00 noon on day of 1st performance. If contestants are trading between the 2nd and 3rd performances, the trade deadline is 12:00 noon on the day of the 2nd performance. Competition positions will be randomly drawn by judges after the trade deadline for each Progressive Performance.
- Replacements in the Progressive Performances will be made for any TO/DR/VIR/TONN from the next eligible contestant based on the times from the qualifying slack. Procom and the rodeo secretary will work together to replace from the eligible contestants until competition time.
- The top two (2) contestants based on fastest times in that respective performance will advance to the Finals. Replacements will be made from the vacated qualifier's performance.
- 10. Progressive Round Advancement Tie Breakers: If there are fewer than two (2) qualified times in that performance, then the replacement will be the next fastest time from any of the Progressive Performances. Ties will be broken by the single fastest time in the

qualifying slack, then the tied contestant with the highest ranking from 2024 Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing World Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing.

- 11. Competition order in the Finals will be random.
- 12. Condensed drag (5) in slack per rule 12.8.2.1.1. Drag after four (4) in Progressive Performances and hand rake after each contestant. Drag after four (4) in Finals and hand rake after each contestant. (Tractor Drag at half for what it is set up for; 5 if set up for 10 and 6 if set up for 12 (Condensed). All notified turn outs and Releases from each performance and slack will be taken out of the draw after the out deadline. Positions will move up and be posted at the rodeo office before the rodeo begins. I.E. If you are number 9 and there are 2 releases prior to you, you will be draw number 7. Committee will drag at 5 or fewer if set up for 10, 6 or fewer if set up for 12. **any notified turnouts who do reverse their turnout with rodeo secretary will run at the end of their performance/slack with no additional dragging for them.)

PAYOFF:

Qualifiers in the Final Round will earn the payoff, with or without a time. If there are fewer qualified times in the Finals than there are places to be paid, the remaining places to be paid to contestants with no time will be based on fastest times in the progressive round and, if necessary, tie-breakers as outlined for advancement. All money paid out for the Finals will count towards the World Standings and Circuit Standings.

GENERAL:

- 1. Olympic style Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the top (three) in the Finals.
- 2. Only actual contestant and one (1) companion allowed gate access. Companion tickets will be sold at a discount to contestants needing additional tickets at check-in.
- 3. Contestants must wear back numbers provided by the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo. The back number must be visible outside a vest or jacket.

- 4. Stalls: Utah Days of '47 Arena at Utah State Fairpark has limited stalls and hookups available at no charge. Stalls are first come, first served. Contestants are requested to arrive no earlier than 10:00 AM on day of their competition, only utilize stalls for the night they are competing, then vacate by 8:00 AM the following day to accommodate the next group of contestants.
- 5. Pushers and other helpers must be credentialed from the rodeo secretary's office. To obtain credentials, the individual must be a member of the WPRA/PRCA with WPRA/PRCA insurance dues paid for the current year.
- 6. The medal winners in each event are required to participate in an awards ceremony immediately following the conclusion of each event. Failure to comply without approval from Committee, will result in a fine of \$2,500.
- All contestants must sign in at the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo Arena at the Utah State Fairpark rodeo secretary's office and enter the facility at 300 North, 1200 West (gate 17) Salt Lake City, 84116.
- 8. ALL CONTESTANTS WITH HORSES: Must have proof of current health papers issued within 30 days and a current Coggins Test within the previous 12 months. Health requirement papers must not expire while the animal is still on the grounds. All animals must be compliant with current Utah State Animal Health Commission rules, and requirements are subject to change. No exceptions. Contestants must abide by the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo regulations for entry and exit with animals. Individuals who violate animal entry policies will be subject to immediate ejection from the premises.
- 9. All contestants must park where designated in the competitor parking area.
- 10. All contestants must wear a Utah Days of '47 Rodeo patch while competing if provided.
- 11. TIMED EVENTS CONTESTANTS: Are not allowed in the arena at any time other than while competing or a predesignated practice session.
- 12. All areas behind the chutes will be considered part of the arena. To gain access to this area, contestants must be dressed according to PRCA rules and have their back numbers visible. Contestants must wear back numbers provided by Utah Days of '47 Rodeo. Back numbers must be clearly visible on the outside of a vest or jacket, at all times upon entrance to and while in the arena whether competing or not.
- 13. Only rodeo contestants with a valid contestant number will be allowed behind the chutes and in the chute or arena area. Numbers must be clearly visible. Anyone caught with an invalid number (one not belonging to them) will have that number confiscated. Anyone giving their number to someone else will be disqualified.
- 14. NO CHILDREN: Are allowed behind chutes, on chute level, or in the arena. No exceptions. This is to ensure the safety of contestants, rodeo personnel, stock and children themselves. Violation will result in immediate removal from the premises.
- 15. TIES FOR MEDAL PLACEMENT IN THE FINALS: In the barrel racing, ties will be broken by the contestant with the fastest time in the Progressive Round. If still tied, the tie is broken by the contestant with the fastest time in round of slack. If still tied, tie is broken by the tied contestant with the highest ranking in 2024 Pro Rodeo Barrel Racing World Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing.

- 16. Contestants will not change clothes in the arena or arena area. Changing of clothes or attire will be done in the contestant locker room. This will be strictly enforced by security.
- 17. DOGS: All dogs must be kept at the trailer and on a leash, with the exception of contract acts.
